INTRODUCTION

Inspired by Section J.2 of the Beijing Platform for Action, which promotes a balanced and non-stereotyped portrayal of women in the media, and the class of Communication Practices, Diversity, and Inclusion, this teacher's manual takes a creative approach to merging artificial intelligence (AI), gender perspectives, and innovative storytelling.

Recognizing that **education** is the foundation for **shaping future generations**, this resource was designed to promote meaningful **change** in the classroom. Change is essential for fostering **inclusivity**, addressing diverse student needs, and breaking down barriers related to race, **gender**, socioeconomic status, and learning abilities.

Inside, educators will find six short stories spanning three distinct genres: Sci-Fi, Romance, and Fairytale. Each story was crafted using *ChatGPT*, featuring both female and male protagonists to explore and examine biases within Al-generated content and storytelling.

To support classroom discussions, the manual includes thought-provoking questions designed to spark dialogue, encourage critical thinking, and inspire action toward creating a more equitable and inclusive world.







To create the stories, we asked *ChatGPT* this question:

Create a short story of 300 words, [story genre], with a [female / male] main character. Please be descriptive about the main character, their personality, their appearance, and their role.

In the following pages, you will read all the 6 short stories. We encourage you to try to spot any biases. As the educator, think about these *questions:

- 1. What is the problem represented to be?
- 2. What are the assumptions underlying the concepts and words used?
- 3. What are the causes of inequality identified?
- 4. How did the representation of the problem arise? Finally, think about what solution you and your students can propose to address these problems.

- was no soldier, but she fought a different kind of war: a battle to preserve knowledge
- had taught her to stay calm, even in chaos

MALE

Physical Description:

- broad shoulders
- dark brown hair, cropped short
- jagged scar traced his jawline
- scavenger

Highlights on Personality Traits:

- his dangerous profession
- determination
- [the future] would need...someone like him

ANALYSIS

- Female is more passive as a "hero" compared to male who is highlighted as someone in a dangerous profession
 - Female story focuses on protagonist's intelligence and ends with how she felt knowledge was worth fighting for
 - Male story focuses on protagonist's physical strength & determination and ends with the ideal future shaped by someone like him
 - The female character's role is simply delivering and defending with "assistance" by an AI and whose intelligence is also "assisted" by a neural implant
 - Comparatively, the male character's role is active scavenge hunting, with the fate of the universe on his hands
- Both characters are described under hegemonic beauty stereotypes
- Although the female character is not associated with characteristics of physical strength, her calm and strong character are highlighted:
 - "Lira faced the encroaching danger with unwavering resolve".
- In the story with a male character, some emotions stand out:
 - o "As Jaxon stepped closer, his heart thrummed"; "Jaxon's chest tightened"

THE SONG OF AMBER LANE

Romance Female

Amber Lane had always been a romantic at heart, though she kept it well hidden behind a veil of practicality. At twenty-eight, she was a librarian in the small seaside town of Lornhaven. Her auburn hair cascaded in loose waves down her back, matching the warm freckles scattered across her pale skin. Beneath her reserved demeanor, Amber was curious and compassionate, though a touch timid when it came to her own heart.

- rakish lock of jet-black hair
- tall, lean
- deep, brown eyes

Highlights on Personality Traits:

- quiet warmth
- patient
- history professor
- creature of habit yet forever chasing serendipity
- captivating with his wit

ANALYSIS

- In both stories, the male character made the first move to the female
- Both stories describe males and females in hegemonic beauty stereotypes
- The female protagonist's profession as a librarian is mentioned but not a crucial part of the plot and her character
- The male protagonist's profession as a history professor is highlighted by the impact it generates on others and is a crucial point of the story
- The female character's personality is romantic and shy, while the male character is attractive, witty, and captivates everyone around him
- In the story with the female protagonist, she is attracted to the male character for his personality
 - o "it was his sensitivity to her music that captured her heart"
- On the other hand, in the story with the male protagonist, he is attracted to the female character for her physical traits
 - "Something about the way she tilted her head, her auburn hair catching the amber glow of the overhead light, froze Julian in place"
- In the story with the female protagonist, romance is something that happens to her, and in the end "vowed to keep her Fridays open for his return"

THE CLOCKMAKER'S DAUGHTER

- father saw function, she saw stories waiting to be told
- heart stirred
- her magic healed the forgotten heart of the land

MALE

Physical Description:

- tall, wiry
- windswept hair
- calm but firm voice
- face weathered by countless nights under the moon

Highlights on Personality Traits:

- Lantern Keeper, protector
- dressed in a long, patched cloak in deep indigo

ANALYSIS

- Female protagonist is described as a widowed man's daughter while the male protagonist is portrayed as a protector
- Both characters are described under hegemonic beauty stereotypes
- Female story portrays her as someone who is sensitive ("heart stirred") and imaginative ("saw stories waiting to be told")
- Male character's appearance description is more related to role, whereas female character's is focused on mere physical features
- The female character is attributed with positive emotions and is discreet, while the male character is described as adventurous and confident when giving help
 - o "I'll need a day," she said softly"; "Elara's heart stirred at the sorrow in his voice"
 - "Without hesitation, Cael slung the lantern over his shoulder and took the child's hand. They journeyed through shadowed woods and across icy rivers, the Starfire illuminating the way"
- The male character is described as someone who "villagers hailed as a hero"
- Although the female character is valued at the end of the story, she is not described as a heroine but rather as someone who has simply "healed" the land
- The female is a fixer and healer while the male is the protector and hero

ACTIVITY: CLASSROOM DISCUSSION

After carefully reading the stories, encourage a reflective discussion among the students. Here are some suggested questions to help them dissect the biases in each story.

- 1. Are female and male characters represented equally throughout the story?
- 2. Does the story depict female and male characters with the same level of respect and potential, particularly in areas like careers or future aspirations?
- 3. Does the narrative consider and reflect the needs and experiences of both male and female characters?
- 4. How are personality traits assigned to the characters? Do they align with traditional notions of femininity or masculinity?
- 5. How is physical appearance described? Are there differences in how feminine and masculine features are portrayed?

ACTIVITY: CREATIVE WRITING

Students will take 15 minutes to write a short story and try to be as descriptive as possible about the main character.

Teachers may suggest prompts to guide their writing such as:

- Write about a character who can see the future
- Write about a doctor who saves someone's life
- Write about a detective who solves crimes
- Write about a character who discovers a secret portal



ACTIVITY: AL IMAGE GENERATION

Copy-paste story into ChatGPT and generate image of the main character. Ensure the prompt used is the same for everyone.

Example:

- Please generate an image of the main character based on my story.
- 이 소설을 바탕으로 이미지를 생성해줘.
- Podes criar uma imagem baseada nessa história curta.

CLASS DISCUSSION

Gather all images and compare.

- What do we notice based on the images?
- Do these images generated by AI show what you had in mind while writing your story?
- What differences do you notice in how the character looks like based on the Al-generated image and what you originally imagined?

Expand and share ideas with classmates.

One alternative is to introduce other ways of criticizing other than gender (eg. expanding into the concept of intersectionality).


