The analysis reveals consistent ideological patterns across Italian, German and U.S. media.

Left-Wing Outlets

- Downplay controversies, celebrating Khelif's right to compete.
- Inconsistencies observed, such as the use of discriminatory imagery.

Center Outlets

- Aim for balanced reporting with neutral language.
- Present multiple perspectives on both the controversy and Khelif's success.

Right-Wing Outlets

- Emphasize traditional values and skepticism toward progressive changes.
 - Use provocative language to frame Khelif's participation as unfair or a violation of gender norms.

WHY FIGHT GENDER BIAS?

WHAT IS A GENDER BIAS?

Gender bias is when someone is treated unfairly or favored because of their gender. It can show up in attitudes, actions, rules, or practices that give one gender an advantage or disadvantage over another.

GOOD

Focus on her as a **gold medal** winner in the Olympics and the unjust accusations





BAD

In this photo she looks unflattering, likely to diminish her seriousness.

HOW TO RECOGNIZE IT?



- ♦ Titles that reinforce stereotypes: ex. "Biological male vs woman boxer"
- A lack of diversity or an overemphasis on one gender
- Women's physical appearance is emphasized over their abilities.
- Images that portray women in a way that reinforces traditional societal expectations
- When an article about a woman focuses solely on gender roles
